

JAIL COMMITTEE MEETING
MINUTES
OCTOBER 17, 2017

Members present: Joel Tjelmeland (chairman), Catie Sheehan (vice-chairman), Tony DelGiorno, Tom Madonia, George Preckwinkle, Rose Ruzic & Linda Douglas-Williams.

Chairman Tjelmeland called the meeting to order at 1200p.

Tjelmeland requested a motion to approve the minutes of the October 3, 2017 Jail Committee meeting. *Motion was made by Douglas Williams & seconded by Sheehan. Motion carried (6-0).*

REPORTS:

Sheriff Barr had nothing to report.

Chief Roesch reported that they were given less than 24 hour's notice that the Luke Bryan concert would be at the Fairgrounds instead of in Edinburg (Friday evening, 10/6). Estimation was 20,000 people. It all went well, considering the weather and having less than 24 hour's notice to plan. The deputies' were assisted by about 15 State Troopers. Captain Williams was instrumental in organizing this & working with Luke Bryan's staff. Lt. Prange was in charge of the TRU (Tactical Response Unit). There were no real issues (couple of fights) –only just a few medical issues. Luke Bryan is reimbursing the Sheriff's office for their salaries. Douglas-Williams asked about the timeline of this event. Barr said his office got a call from Christian County Thursday morning (10/5) and said he was given a heads up that it might happen but Barr said they would call him back that afternoon & let them know for sure. Security began setting the perimeter starting at noon on Friday (10/6). At the end of the concert Luke Bryan honored all law enforcement.

Superintendent Beck reported the jail count was 339. Overtime was up last week. We had 6 PTI graduates. We will have 3 more to class in January. Gateway reported to Beck that their program has had more participants than they anticipated and 100% of the participants showed up for their follow up appointments (after leaving jail)

Coroner Edwards said that the weekend was quiet. She reminded the committee that temporarily they will be doing autopsies at St. Johns while Memorial remodels their autopsy suite. It will take about 2-3 months. Her department is looking for a different parking solution since they can't park east of the tracks anymore. DelGiorno asked if they could temporarily park in the visitor lot across from the front of the building. Edwards is going to check into it.

New Business:

Tim Eggleston:

- MJ Kellner approval \$8,862.05 Chairman Tjelmeland asked for a motion to approve MJ Kellner. *DelGiorno made a motion to approve & Preckwinkle seconded. Motion carried (7-0)*

Old Business: none.

Chairman Tjelmeland requested a motion to approve the requisitions for the Sheriff & Coroner. *Sheehan made a motion to approve and Douglas-Williams seconded. Motion carried (7-0).*

Madonia made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Ruzic. Motion carried (7-0) and the meeting adjourned at 12:13pm.
