**VII. AGENCY UPDATES**

**A. Springfield-Sangamon County Regional Planning Commission**

Shannan Karrick told the Committee that work was continuing on the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan. She added that SSCRPC staff would work with individual SATS constituents to ensure that projects and priorities are added to the plan.

**B. Sangamon Mass Transit District (SMTD)**

No report was given.

**C. City of Springfield**

Bonnie Drew announced the following:

- The Archer Elevator Road project was suspended for the winter with work beginning again in spring, 2020.
- The Laurel Street underpass was progressing with relocation of utilities and sewers
- Embankment work continued on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Street rail bridges.

**D. Sangamon County**

No report was given.

**E. Illinois Department of Transportation: Region 4, District 6**

Sal Madonia told the Committee that a consultant for Phase I planning study of the MacArthur Boulevard reconstruction project would be selected on January 29, 2020. The project would include MacArthur Boulevard between South Grand Avenue and Stanford Avenue. Mr. Madonia was unsure when construction would begin for the project.

**F. Village of Chatham**

No report was given.

## VIII. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Ronald Walker addressed the Committee. He said that he did not believe that there was enough room for bus benches on MacArthur Boulevard near Outer Park Drive. He asked that MacArthur Boulevard be planned for Complete Streets and able to accommodate multiple modes of transportation. He also noted that pedestrians were at risk during precipitation events because of the current pavement condition on MacArthur and he hoped that some temporary overlay could be applied in the interim before reconstruction.

Mr. Walker asked about the timeline for SMTD to replace its current fare collection technology. Frank Squires told Mr. Walker that SMTD staff were preparing a Request for Proposals and that the project would proceed after some technical issues had been resolved. Mr. Walker suggested that SMTD consider implementing smartphone passes as part of the project. Mr. Walker expressed his frustration with the current punch-card fare collection system and asked if there would be an interim solution for the punch-card shortcomings. Mr. Squires said that he would speak with SMTD drivers and staff.

Steven Simpson-Black addressed the Committee. He called their attention to a rail bridge over Interstate 55 that had been converted to the Nickel Plate Trail. He noted that the Madison County Transit authority had painted the bridge for aesthetic effect. He expressed his wish that Sangamon County would do a similar treatment to the rail bridge over Interstate 72 when it designs the southern extension of the Sangamon Valley Trail.



Ms. Karrick noted that painting the bridge would fit the City of Springfield's stated goal for the beautification of routes leading into the city. Ms. Drew agreed and said that the City was planning to wrap bridges and improve aesthetics on Clear Lake Avenue.
