I. CALL TO ORDER

Patrick McCarthy called the meeting of the SATS Technical Committee to order at 8:30 AM.

II. APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES: June 7, 2018

Chair McCarthy asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes of the June 7, 2018 Technical Committee meeting. Brian Davis made a motion to approve the minutes as submitted. Molly Berns seconded the motion. The vote to approve was unanimous.

III. 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP)

A. Amendment 26: 5th and 6th Street Underpasses

Neha Soni Introduced Amendment 26:



**RESOLUTION TO RECOMMEND APPROVAL OF
AMENDMENT TWENTY-SIX TO THE
2040 LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN**

WHEREAS, the Springfield Area Transportation Study (SATS), in cooperation with the Illinois Department of Transportation, has a comprehensive, cooperative, and continuing (3C) planning process for transportation planning in compliance with Federal regulations for the urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, the SATS Long Range Transportation Plan takes a long-term (25-year) look at transportation needs in the Springfield Metropolitan Planning Area; envisions an efficient, interconnected, multi-modal travel network; and identifies projects to make this vision a reality; and

WHEREAS, the Long Range Transportation Plan is updated every five years and was most recently updated on March 12, 2015 as the SATS 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan; and

WHEREAS, all projects with identified funding sources and anticipated to be completed during the period 2015 – 2019 are listed as Committed Projects in the 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City of Springfield requests that the following project be added to the “Committed Projects” list in the SATS 2040 LRTP; and

Brian Davis made a motion to recommend approval of Amendment 4 to the 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program to the Policy Committee. Molly Berns seconded the motion. The vote to recommend approval was unanimous.

IV. 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program

A. ST-U Projects Update

Nate Bottom announced the following:

- i. **Stanford Avenue (11th to Fox Bridge)**
The engineering and plans for the project were complete, but the project has been moved back on the programming schedule in order to prioritize another project on Archer Elevator Road.
- ii. **Archer Elevator Road/Iles Avenue**
The project was finishing up, with pavement marking and seeding left to complete.

Brian Davis announced the following:

- iii. **Bradfordton Road**
No changes.
- iv. **Woodside Road**
The project was estimated to be 50% complete. Temporary striping was anticipated to begin shortly after the meeting date. He commented that the Sangamon County Highway Department had been working with the Sangamon County Sherriff's Department to curb speeding and dangerous driving through the construction area. He said that between 15 and 20 tickets had been issued to drivers speeding more than 15 miles per hour over the work zone speed limit. Mr. Davis said that the County was working with the Sheriff to make a joint announcement regarding speeding in construction zones.

B. Amendment 5 5th and 6th Street Underpasses

Molly Berns told the Committee that SSCRPC had been awarded \$90,000 of planning funds from IDOT. She said that the planning funds would be used to update the Land Evolution Assessment Model (LEAM). The land use model would be updated with economic data for better modeling accuracy.

Ash Street Underpass (TIP # 02-2018-05):

Laurel Street Underpass (TIP # 02-2018-06):

Girders were being set for the bridge, with embankment work begun between Laurel Street and Ash Street.

11th Street Extension (TIP # 02-2009-03):

Paving was being completed with traffic signal installation beginning soon after the meeting date. He anticipated the project area to be opened to traffic in August, 2018.

Jackson Street Streetscape

Electrical work was complete and it was anticipated to be ready before July 14, 2018.

Sidewalk Improvements

- Cook Street at Livingston

Annual Maintenance Projects

Overlays began on Monroe Street between Chatham Road and Grant Middle School. Concrete work in anticipation of overlays began on Outer Park Drive and Ash Street.

High Speed Rail Project

Signal upgrades and pedestrian gates had begun at Monroe Street. Concrete and sidewalk work continued at Adams Street and Washington Street.

D. Sangamon County

Brian Davis Updated the following projects:

Turkey Run Road Bridge:

The project was anticipated for a July, 2018 letting. The project was a bridge structure replacement with no flood plain impacts.

Work was anticipated to begin July 9 on a collapsed storm sewer in Chatham along Plummer Boulevard. He said the Village would call for bids to resurface Walnut Street.
